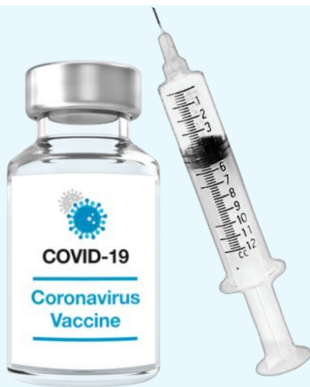

To help you stay safe from Coronavirus

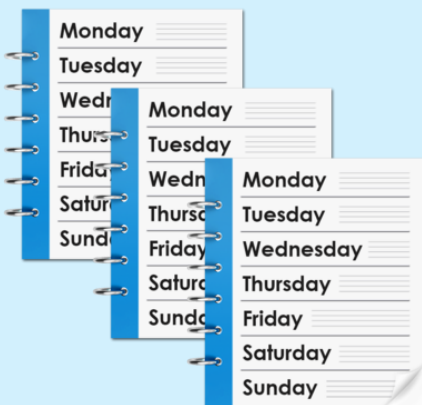




Getting help to have the Coronavirus vaccine



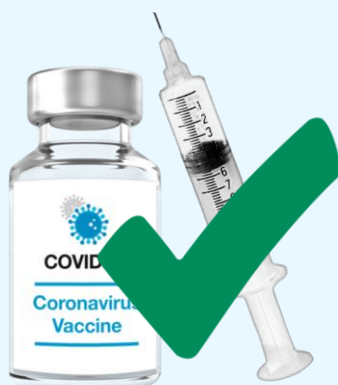
The Coronavirus vaccine is an injection.



You will need 2 injections of the vaccine, 3 to 12 weeks apart.

Some people will also be offered a third injection, called a booster.

We will tell you when it is time for your injections.



The Vaccine has been tested to make sure it is safe.

Your Vaccine Appointment



It is your turn to have the vaccine for Covid-19

It's really important to have the vaccine when it is your turn.



Having the vaccine makes you less likely to get very ill from Coronavirus.



Some people may like extra help with booking and having their vaccine.



Reasonable adjustments



Reasonable adjustments are changes that are made to make things easier to do or understand.



to make sure that services work well for people who may need extra support. For example, easy read documents.



You can ask for reasonable adjustments to be made to help you to get your vaccine.



Good things to know



Did you know that you can take someone with you to help you get your vaccine?



You can ask if there is a quiet room at the vaccine site.



If there are lots of people waiting you can ask if you can move up the queue.



What to do if you have been invited to have your vaccine and would like support.



When you book your appointment let them know what support you will need to have your vaccine.



You can also let the vaccine centre know when you arrive for your appointment.



You may want to ask someone you trust, like a friend or family member to help you arrange the support you need to get your vaccine.
